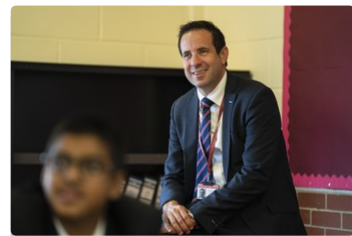


Headteacher's Newsletter

Nails And Lashes

There are still some students who are spending money at the weekends or during holidays on getting false nails and eyelashes. Students are not permitted to wear nail varnish, false nails or eyelashes and will not be permitted to attend lessons until they have them removed at their own expense. Please do

not allow your children to spend money on false nails or eyelashes or to paint their nails as this rule is very clear and it causes conflict between the student and the school. There is no grey area and I would appreciate your support in this matter.

Littering Outside Of School

I recently received a letter from the Environmental Agency from Epping Forest following a complaint about littering from our students on Chigwell Road and the High Road. The letter states they will fine individuals £75 on the spot if they receive evidence of them dropping litter. Please discuss this with your children.

Shoes

Please remember that students must be wearing school shoes unless they have medical evidence of an injury. We have spare school shoes available if students wear trainers to school and even if a parent writes a note, without medical evidence the student will be expected to wear our shoes. I understand that the closer the summer comes the more reticent parents are to buy new shoes but students are required to wear proper shoes to school right up until we break for the summer. Any student refusing to put the schools' shoes on will be isolated until they do so.

Pupils Behaviour To Each Other Outside Of School

I'm becoming increasingly concerned with the number of incidents we are having to deal with between students which are occurring outside of school, in the evenings, at weekends or even during school holidays. Many of these occur via social media and the school are being expected to pick up the pieces even though the issues happen well beyond the school gates. Many schools have started to draw a line and say they will not take responsibility for these types of incidents unless they cause an issue in school time.

My view is that the school should support parents in dealing with these issues, however we are spending an inordinate amount of time investigating incidents beyond our control and I may have to act differently in the future. Please do your best to monitor and moderate your child's behaviour on social media, it seems young people become very different people behind a phone and say things they would never say to someones face. Remember the legal age for Instagram, Snap Chat and many other social media apps is 13. I would appreciate you discussing this matter with your children.

The school sent our Year 13 and 11 students on their way in traditional fashion before half term with our annual leavers events. A fun day was had by all and the students from both Year groups were an absolute credit to the school and their parents. Two emotional days saying goodbye, giving out awards and remembering their time at school, I hope the students leave with fond memories of the day and their time at West Hatch.
