Driving onto the school site

As a result of the building works we have very limited parking space at school for vehicles. Parents are not permitted to drive into school and drop off their children. Please can I ask those visiting the school for any reason, to park outside of the gates and walk in. Many of our staff are having to park outside because of the building work as well. Cars bringing children into school during the start and the end of the day, parking near or across the school entrance or performing U turns on the main road, cause a significant risk to the health, safety and well being of our students and I would ask that everyone please considers this when driving to school.Thank you for your support in this matter.

Uniform reminder

Below you will see a link to the school's uniform list which clearly outlines our expectations with regards to school uniform. There are no real changes this year but please remember as the weather begins to change that students are only permitted to wear black, navy or dark grey coats. Any other colour will be confiscated.

Last year we had a number of students wearing trainers to school despite the school's policy being clear that students must wear appropriate school shoes. This year we have purchased a large number of school shoes and any pupil coming to school wearing trainers without a medical note, will be expected to wear a pair of our shoes each day. We will have antibacterial spray and ensure the shoes are in good order. Students refusing to wear the shoes will be isolated until they are wearing appropriate footwear.

Another quick reminder that Year 11 students still have to wear blazers to school, although they are permitted to wear black jumpers instead of grey ones under their blazer.

Please support the school and your children by ensuring they have the appropriate uniform at all times.

my ed app

I would like to remind you about the MyEd App which the school has purchased on behalf of our parents. We have received excellent feedback about this service from parents. This App allows you to view a huge amount of school information as well as key material specifically about your child, for example timetables, rewards and behaviour logs, as well as accessing their progress checks. Please note that when signing up for the App you must use **the same contact email address and mobile number** that the school hold for the priority 1 contact on your child's record. The reason for this is that the system will link your child/children to your MyEd account automatically based on the information we hold and the information that you enter when signing up. This is also where the security codes will be sent to for the initial configuration of the App. If your contact information has changed please let the school know of these details via the admin email before signing up for the App.
