by Liz Hyder

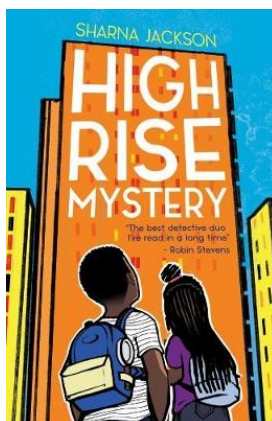
